 #060-2020 - SUPPORTING THE ENACTMENT OF ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 3971 AND SENATE BILL NO. 2475 TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF CORONAVIRUS RELIEF BONDS BY MUNICIPALITIES AND COUNTIES WHEREAS, municipalities and counties throughout New Jersey are facing unprecedented financial

challenges, including significant loss of revenue and unanticipated spending, due to the ongoing COVID-19 State of Emergency and Public Health Emergency; and

WHEREAS, without relief, local government may have to significantly reduce services and layoff personnel; and

WHEREAS, in response to these conditions, Assemblymen Benson and Coughlin introduced A-3971 and Senator Singleton introduced S-2475, which authorizes local units to issue "coronavirus relief bonds" to allow them to borrow money, with a ten-year payback period, to cover shortfalls and unanticipated costs that are a direct result of the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, such bonds will provide local units with the flexibility to ensure continuation of essential services.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough of Laurel Springs that it hereby affirms its support for the enactment of A-3971 and S-2475.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk shall be directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Governor, Senate President, Assembly Speaker and the legislative delegation of the 4th district. Councilman Redstreake asked what the dollar amount for these relief bonds will allow, to which it was discussed that this allows issuance of Coronavirus relief debt that stays within each municipalities debt cap.

• COVID-19-Permit for Villari's – Borough Administrator Cheeseman spoke to the Police Department about the submitted plan and questions about them being open to 2 am and whether that is too late, and whether live entertainment is even allowed with consideration to neighborhood proximities. Councilman Cruz said setting up in the parking lot is temporary only until July when things will open up more, so they should be allowed to open outside. Councilman Redstreake concurred saying the Borough has to be business friendly. No objections to any of the matters were objected to by Borough Council.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Carolyn Redstreake – commented that the Memorial Day Drive-by was a success. Regarding the Fourth of July, the Borough should be able to have. Councilman DelPidio commented that it is run by volunteers and if they choose to, let them do it. The Fire Department does not direct any specific part other than those who volunteer. No assembly downtown should be encouraged. Councilwoman DiGregorio commented that the Patriotic Memorial Day Parade was pretty great. The previous Thursday the Freeholder Director and the Assembly representative Aide said a municipality cannot allow a parade. You can protest as an exception, but there must be no congregation. There was further discussion of the same format as Memorial Day. Mr. Kane did point out that the Fourth of July is on a Saturday, so a lot of people will be away, so it is not likely that there would be a lot of people. There was further discussion of today's protest , which is their right and that's great, but the children from our town can't play on the playground equipment at the School, yet the protesters can congregate and use the playground equipment or have a Fourth of July Parade. There was a discussion of the messaging of the protestors, and additional discussion of the protestors vs. towns' children in the use of the school ground equipment. It was stated that it was up to the Fire Department and those volunteers' decision not a Borough decision. Mr. Lippincott gave historical perspective on Memorial Day.
